Bro. Ron Spencer's Answer:

Jesus said "to search the scriptures in them ye think ye have eternal life and they are they that do testify of me." Paul said "if an angel from heaven preach any other gospel than that we have preached unto you let him be accursed."

The word will have a manifestation of the fruit produced, not by emotion but by the reality of a true experience of your own. If you can be taught or reasoned into a revelation you can be reasoned out of a revelation. It must be a personal experience backed by the word. WORD TESTED.

Bro. Vince Barnhart's Answer:

You can not know "The Message" is truth until you have poured your self into "The Message". And what is "The Message"?

Questions & Answers With A Sister

Question #1

How can I get a guy to stop liking me without hurting his feelings?

How can you get a guy to stop liking you? You cannot get someone to stop liking you without being

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the meaning of symbols in the Bible, don't let some other influence re-interpret them to you.

At the beginning of this article, here's the ending: If there was ever a time to get things in order it is now. What manner of people should we be, how much more warning do we need to have? I travel through various countries, I read the Message and the Bible, talk with ministers, military personnel, and follow the media and I see and hear of so many things coming to pass now just as God said. I have been asked to share my understanding of events unfolding in our world today, but I will guarantee you that Satan wants your mind and focus diverted to things that don't matter.

According to the pattern of the Bible, God is very consistent in His dealings with His people. The Lord is also faithful to warn and prepare His people for anything significant that comes our way. (Remember Y2K? No warning found in the Message or the Bible. That was all influenced by the media.) There are many things already spoken that are intended to cause us to know and prepare for an "end" which is as real as Noah's flood or the destruction of Sodom or the destruction of Jerusalem in AD 70. The coming of a prophet itself is a major event, a marker in time that is meant to jolt us, alert us, awaken us, tune us into exactly what God is about to do. He reveals His Word by bringing it to pass in season, so what we know, we know by revelation.

So certain conditions have to pre-exist before destruction actually comes. Remember that this

destruction is not for the Bride people, there is always a group that escapes the oncoming storm. They are made aware because of the work of the Holy Spirit they are sensitive to the times as a result of the grace of God. But these conditions would include:

1. The days of Noah and Sodom must repeat according to Matthew 24

2. There must be a Shout (a Message by a vindicated prophet) and a coming destruction which is not apparent to the cosmos. (1 Thes. 5:3)

3. And, people must actually get into the spirit of the events of their time.

Here's what Bro. Branham said:

"The people are in the spirit of the last days, just like they was in the days of Noah, eating, drinking, marrying, giving in marriage, unconcerned, don't care, walk around, and anything else. And these American people is the worst on the face of the earth..." (Israel at the Red Sea 53-0326)

There are such significant events about to transpire, that God actually sends a Prophet like Moses or Elijah, and shouts to the world to prepare and the people are stuck in the rut of their creeds and denominational ideas and they won't be moved! I don't want to be like that. People say, Tell us

about prophecies and gifts, but don't tell us how to live! Also, as we look at this, remember there are events happening in the foreground and in the background at the same time. Natural events are seen by all, but spiritual events are spiritually discerned.

Let's focus for a minute on the location of the current struggle in Iraq. Most of it is taking place on or near the Euphrates River. What does the Bible say about that?



"12 And the sixth angel poured out his vial upon the great river Euphrates; and the water thereof was dried up, that the way of the kings of the east might be prepared.

13 And I saw three unclean spirits like frogs come out of the mouth of the dragon, (ROME) and out of the mouth of the beast, (CATHOLIC SYSTEM) and out of the mouth of the false prophet. (POPE)

14 For they are the spirits of devils, working miracles, which go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty.

15 Behold, I come as a thief. Blessed is he that watcheth, and keepeth his garments, lest he walk naked, and they see his shame.

16 And he gathered them together into a place called in the Hebrew tongue Armageddon.

(Rev. 16:12-16)

Something has to bring the nations of the world to Armageddon; a gathering has to take place there. This last event becomes the great battle prophesied before the Wedding Supper and the Millennium. Again the Scripture prophecies:

1 Behold, the day of the LORD cometh, and thy spoil shall be divided in the midst of thee.

2 For I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to battle; ...Then shall the LORD go forth, and fight against those nations, as when he fought in the day of battle. (Zech. 14:1-3)

Saddam Hussein compares himself and his “mission” to that of ancient King Nebuchadnezzar who lived in Babylon, the city that



stood on the banks of the Euphrates in modern Iraq or Persia. The area called Persia once controlled all of the region round about the Middle East and parts beyond, that’s why Saddam acts like he owns the place (like all the oil in Kuwait and the water in Turkey), he believes he is a modern Nebuchadnezzar.

The Euphrates is first mentioned in Scripture as one of the four rivers of Eden ([Gen. 2:14](#)).

The Euphrates is linked with some of the most important events in ancient history. Watch again what Bro. Branham says in the message “Preparation” (53-1111)

“...I believe that the people are in the preparation of the last great destruction this world will ever know. I believe we’re at the end. They are in the spirit of the last days. And God cannot send destruction before the people are in the spirit for destruction. God never did destroy anything. Man always destroys himself.”

Then he also says about the Euphrates River in response to a written question:

“What significance does the Euphrates River have in the Bible spiritually speaking?”

The Euphrates river, it’s always been a great river, because the Euphrates river has a great place in the Bible. The first place we find, that it run right through Eden. The next thing we find out, the Euphrates river also was a river that come right straight down through Babylon—same river. Now, we find out that the Angel poured out his vial upon the Euphrates river and dried it up, that the king of the north might come down. And I think what that will actually be, will be at the end time when they come into Armageddon. See, they have to come right down through Egypt there, to get into it. Right down through them countries, they’ll have to cross the Euphrates to get in there. See, the Euphrates river runs today. ...See, making way for the king of the north to come down. That’ll take place during the

time of the battle of Armageddon in the last days..”

So we know according to the order of events that once Laodicea goes into chaos; the Bride goes to glory; and the tribulation period sets in upon the sleeping virgin for three and a half years while Israel is getting its prophecy; then tribulation sets in upon Israel; and then comes the battle of Armageddon which destroys all things. And then, the Bride returns back with the Groom for a thousand years, the millennium reign; after that comes the white throne judgment; after that comes the new heavens and new earth and the new city coming down from God out of heaven. Eternity and time blends together. And of course, the great battle of Gog and Magog (Russia) will occur after the taking away of the Bride! You can read [Ezekiel 38:18-22](#). Get a good world map and look at how the River Euphrates is a great natural divide between the kingdoms of the East and North (China, Russia, etc.) and the oil rich nations of the Middle East and Israel!

So in the same way we had to have a Roman general named Titus to fulfill prophecy, and Communism to fulfill prophecy, we had to have a “Saddam Hussein” in the world, sitting on the Euphrates River. He sits at the gateway for the kingdoms of the East and the North until he is “removed.” But Brother Branham didn’t tell us to watch Iraq, but Russia. We’ve been sort of lulled to sleep about Russia. The biggest nuclear arsenal is there, the most weapons of mass destruction are there, the prophecies and Bible

verses concerning it will come to pass. The “Bear” (Russia) goes down to the Middle East after the oil one day. Again, here’s Brother Branham:

“Now, Daniel is given this assurance, that at the end of the Gentile dispensations... (Dan.11). You can see how the king of the north is coming down (which is nothing else but Russia), coming down to press against it like a whirlwind. And the great battle of Armageddon will be fought right there near the gates of Jerusalem.” (*Beginning & Ending of the Gentile Dispensation 55-0109E*)

According to what we know, there are huge national fortunes wrapped up in agreements concerning Iraq’s oil, they are made between nations, so if Iraq goes down, the agreements are dissolved. New agreements must be negotiated, and bids are already being submitted by new (British and American firms) to rebuild the Iraqi infrastructure and sell oil. By the way, the largest supplier of arms and technology to Iraq are Russia, France and North Korea.

Of the 22 nations surrounding Israel, not one is a democracy. Not one. And they don’t want it or anything like it. There will never be lasting peace in the Middle East without the Prince of Peace! But the President believes he is genuinely acting in the best interest of the American people in rising up against whoever threatens America’s interests or people, wherever on whatever terms. The link between terror and Iraq and N. Korea is real, but it is all being used to fulfill the prophecies for our time. (Check out Revelations

13:11-13, watch how truly it speaks of America!)

In the COD book (54-0103M 67-56), Brother Branham compares AD 70 and today’s Jerusalem:

“And so, now, as Jerusalem compassed about with armies, but literally, historically, that was during about A.D. {70} when Titus had besieged Jerusalem. But now watch this closely... This last one will be by atomic bomb. But this is by the edge of sword, and the Jews was to be led away captive to all nations. It’ll never be that way again; they’ll be gathered in Palestine for the last time.”

I have personally stood in the valley of Armageddon and pondered the last great battle to occur there, it must come to prepare the earth for the Millennium.

In the message called Victory Day (63-0421), Brother Branham said:

“... We’ve had several wars, wars, and rumors of wars... It’ll finally wind up into the great battle of Armageddon. That’ll be the last of it. When she comes to the battle of Armageddon, that’ll settle the whole thing. Just before the great millennium, Armageddon is to clean off the earth.”

So what does all this say to you? We can easily become disconnected with all the media attention over a war “far away,” but in reality it is all setting the stage for the events necessary to take the Bride home to Glory. Finally, Brother Branham says in 1963,

“Desperation, signs of His coming should throw every member of Christ into desperation now, about our souls, about our welfare for hereafter. Well, what are we going to amount to if we gain the whole world? What are we living for? What do you work for? What are you eating for? What are you struggling for? To live. What are you living for? To die. And you’re not fit to live until you’re fit to die” (Desperation 63-0901).

Get ready, for everything God said will come to pass some day!

Amazing how many people, young and old, have come across "The Message" (Word for their Day) and are posed with the same question that Pilate asked Jesus, "What is truth?" ([John 18:37-38](#)) But instead of finding the answer for themselves, they give into "what the majority wants".

The majority in Jesus' day wanted to crucify him, what about the Word made flesh for today? The old phrase "The truth hurts" is true, but I like the verse that says "The Truth sets you free!" So young people, what is truth? Sure, many denominational Christians are good people. I am not disputing that a bit, but what happens when faced with Jesus Christ for today? I am sure the people in Jesus' day that wanted him crucified were good people. Church going people, even thought what they were doing was what God would want. The majority accepted Barrabas.

As far as taking what my parents say, I would like to say that until you have received the Holy Ghost, your Holy Ghost filled parents are your Holy Ghost. There aren't perfect parents, but there is a perfect Word that your parents are following, and if you aren't following It, pray and seek It for yourself.

Question #2

Bro. Aaron McGeary's Answer:

Yes, it is possible. Peter told the Believers to abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul ([I Peter 2:11](#)). He did not suppose that a Christian would not have these problems (Romans 7). But he admonishes us to abstain and flee from these lusts and the things that entice them. Read [I Corinthians 10:12-13](#). Never think you can do it on your own. If you have confidence in your own ability, you will fall. But trust the Lord that He has made a way to escape these temptations. Remember, the Lord knoweth how to deliver the GODLY out of temptation. To make it simple:

- 1) Repent
- 2) Abstain
- 3) Trust in God to deliver you and keep you from falling.

Bro. Ron Spencer's Answer:

If you have the true experience of the Holy Ghost the desires will change. The overcoming will be a battle on a day to day war. RECOGNIZE--BATTLE--OVERCOME

Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth will speak giving a testimony of which dog is winning the war.

Bro. Vince Barnhart's Answer:

Possible? Yes. Controllable? Yes. Camp atmospheres are great. Sweeping move of the Holy Spirit. You're filled, all cleaned out, and you're washed by the Word. But what happens to that atmosphere? Remember you are creators yourselves. You can create a good or bad atmosphere. Paul wrote "you must die at camps and conventions?" No! Daily, that's one day after camp, one week, one year and on. There are many types of lust, for both young men and women. Remember the story of the Indian chief Bro. Branham talked with? The war going on between the black dog and the white dog. Who wins? The one that is fed the most. There is a war that goes on everyday for your soul. The battleground is in your mind, and Satan has made this age an age where a woman's beauty and her figure is plastered everywhere. When you see a woman scantily dressed on the street, turn your head. Do not give your mind the time to dwell on lust thoughts. To the sisters, if you're dressed in such a way as to cause a man to lust, you will stand judgment for causing that man to commit

adultery in his heart. You are who you are when you are alone. Videos, music, internet and such tickle the senses, but do nothing for the soul. Only God's Word feeds the soul. You will find your desires change as you grow in the Lord. Your spiritual taste buds crave to hear His Word and read His Word. That is hard to do, I know that is hard to do. But when wanting to overcome anything, answers are found in your creating an atmosphere where the Holy Spirit can mold you and make you a better christian. Feed the white dog!

Question #3

I just received the Holy Ghost, what can I expect on the battlefield now? Will the going be any easier?

Bro. Aaron McGeary's Answer:

Victory!! My fellow soldier, you can expect victory (I Corinthians 15:57)! Through Christ you now can do all things (Philippians 4:13).

By Him you are now more than a conqueror (Romans 8:37). Grant it, the way will not be easy. There will be sufferings, hardships, temptations, and trials, but through Christ you can expect to overcome and be victorious (I John 5:4). It may seem like the battle is worse now than it was before. But remember, before you received the Holy Ghost you lost without a fight. Now there is actually a bat-



tle, and the Word promises you WILL WIN! So on the battlefield, do not expect it to be easy, but expect victory through the Lord Jesus Christ!

Bro. Ron Spencer's Answer:

We're not on a picnic, welcome to war. The greatest enemy that you have is yourself "you must put on the whole armor of God." You must keep watering the experience over and over again.

Bro. Vince Barnhart's Answer:

Satan's big gun is telling you that you don't have the Holy Ghost. He just loves to tell people they don't have It after they profess It. Ever hear that voice? "Oh, you aren't a Christian, you're not a Believer because you did..." I call it conviction versus condemnation. The Holy Spirit convicts a person, Satan condemns a person. If you slip and fall, and you will, but get up and repent and then a voice comes around letting you know about it, ask yourself, "Whose voice is this?" If it is

something you haven't fully, and I mean fully, repented of, then the Holy spirit is convicting you. But if it something in your past, that you have fully repented of, placed under the blood, why would God bring it up again if it's placed in the sea of His forgetfulness? The book of Romans says, "There is therefore no condemnation..." I found this battle very common among young and old believers

alike. Spirit filled believers, yet Satan is a very good adversary to fill our minds with doubt and reasoning. See yourself as God sees you. Filled with His spirit, walking in His Word, conforming to Him!

Question #4

How can I cultivate a stronger relationship with Christ and how can I build a strong commitment to Him in my life?

Bro. Aaron McGeary's Answer:

Pray, pray, read your Bible everyday (Ephesians 6:18). Prayer in a Christian's life can never be overemphasized. Paul even went so far as to command us to pray without ceasing (I Thessalonians 5:17)! In a natural relationship, communication is essential to growing stronger. The same holds true in our relationship with Christ. We must pray, pray, read our Bibles everyday! Also, live for others (Philippians 2). By giving of yourself unselfishly you will form a stronger bond with Christ who has freely given of Himself (Galatians 2:20).

Bro. Ron Spencer's Answer:

Serve the Lord with all thy strength, mind and energy. Nurture your experience with praying, reading and witnessing to others. Accountability to strong Christians brings in a great strength when you really need it. ALWAYS be honest with yourself as well. Jesus Christ must be our 1st priority.

Bro. Vince Barnhart's Answer:

This one has no secret formula for an answer, and the formula sounds so easy. But Satan has a way of trying to put a stop to the formula. Brother Branham gave us the formula. Are you ready? Read your bible and pray everyday. A Christian has to! Sounds easy, huh? But in this day of fast everything, hurry here, go there - the days just fly by. Satan makes sure our days are filled. But I believe we have to take time or we backslide. Simple. But as young people, you have a greater opportunity now to develop that relationship. Cultivate that ground. Activities are fine. Gatherings and fellowships are fine. But many times Jesus went ALONE to pray. I believe that is when we become stronger. When we slow down, get away from everyone and talk to God. Now here is the key: wait. Don't pray to God like you are reading off a grocery list of things you want. Ask Him for your hearts desire, thank Him, praise Him and then sit quietly. Let Him speak to your heart. Another thing I like to do, on a more personal level, I like to read the book of Psalms out loud. David is like us many times. We are up and many times we are down. Find the time to be alone.

Question #5

How can I control my tongue towards my parents and others?

Bro. Aaron McGeary's Answer:

Get the Holy Ghost. The Bible teaches that the tongue is an

unruly member which no man can tame (James 3). This tells us that without the Holy Ghost we do not have a chance. With the Holy Ghost, you can ask God to soften your heart and sweeten your spirit, so that your tongue is no longer speaking abundantly from a bitter fountain (Matthew 12:34-35).

Bro. Ron Spencer's Answer:

"Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh" Allow the Holy Ghost to tame and discipline your tongue. If the heart is not right the desires and our speech will not be right.

Eze 36:26,27; James 3


Bro. Vince Barnhart's Answer:

When you find yourself battling your parents, is this battle really a battle of your tongue or is it deeper? Like a problem of respect? Or maybe you have a boss who you just can't seem to get along with? Respect for authority is a deep problem that plagues many youth today - and tongue problems go hand in hand with this. Pray for respect and give those in authority over you their due respect. God will bless you and you will find your tongue that used to be quick with sarcasm is now pleasant. Remember, in the virtues they are "add to's." Add to your faith virtue and so on. You build upon faith, and then add from there. And the key? Christ is the one who does the adding! I urge you to listen to message "Stature of a Perfect Man."

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disagreeable, in which case you are probably going to shock him into thinking you are unmannerly. What you may want is that he gets the message that you do not appreciate his attentions or that you don't want him to think his attentions mean a lot more to you than what they do.

Either way you are going to 'hurt' his feelings. Don't try to rescue his feelings or feel sorry for him. Let him go! Leaving it for later will only make it more difficult for him to accept. Your chief concern is not to 'save his feelings' but your need to clarify that his insistence will only turn you off.

Be as firm as you can be. You want him to review his feelings and come to the conclusion that he needs to give his attention elsewhere.

Realizing that you are dealing with a son of God, you would want him to know you respect him as such but that you are not in any way impressed by his attentions. Let him know that your interests at present are somewhere else (if it is). If you are not interested now or don't think you will be in the near future, let him know that you have plenty other things to think about. You may enlist the aid of your parents or a discreet adult to emphasize in a gentle way your lack of interest.

Do not at this point in any way express admiration for him, accept any gift from him or even accept any invitation from him. Treat him the same as you would any other acquaintance of yours. Be certain to give him no encouragement or inspire hope in him.

Therefore in greeting be as brief as you can be. Do not spend time with him or listen to him or share ideas and knowledge with him, which will only invoke the desire in him to pursue.

Of course be discreet. Don't discuss him unduly with others. He will therefore have continued respect for you and thank you one day for your stand, since he will evidently find his right partner.

Question #2

Is it OK to use concealer makeup to hide skin blemishes?

The use of makeup is looked upon as taboo especially when we know that the first person who used make up or painted her face was Jezebel. Painting of faces finds their roots in heathenism. The Prophet told us that the putting on of such shows that we are at war with God and taking it off that we are at peace with God.

However when a skin blemish develops and is spotted on the skin it can create a complex for the individual, as she becomes more and more conscious of it. Hiding it can become the most important thing to do because the last thing you want is for it to be on your face. Horror fills the heart of the person as a dark patch appears under an eye or on one side of the face, particularly when one is fair skinned. These blemishes arise due to pregnancy or as a result of aging and may be only surface or deep-rooted.

Concealer makeup seems to be the answer should there be no other alternative to remove or hide the mark. Although there are cheaper varieties, concealer makeup can be very expensive. It has to be specifically made up to match your skin colour.

The purpose should be for the blemish locally and not as a coverup for the whole face. When it is a severe case of acne, trying to conceal them for its duration may be useful. Not all blemishes can be concealed in this way.

Concealer makeup cannot therefore be looked upon as wanting to paint your face, but as a means of hiding imperfections, which are a hindrance and a constant source of embarrassment to the individual. However it is hoped that your confidence would grow enough in what God has made you to realize that people will accept you the way you are.

Question #3

Is it OK to trim the ends of our hair?

Trimming the split ends of our hair, or even burning the ends of the hair to even the hairline are all ways of 'cutting' the hair. The bible says not to cut our hair. Hair that is short yet uncut is long hair. Hair that is long and treated to the effects of the scissors is short.

Long hair is the woman's Nazarite vow to the Lord. (Refer to Numbers Chapter 6:2 - the Nazarite vow for man and woman). It shows she is subject to the authorities in her life- the wife to her husband and the young girl

to her father.

In this age cut and bobbed hair is a sign of a total disregard for the authority of the man as the leader. The woman who does not have a covering or have long 'cut' hair may as well shave all her hair, for her attitude is not one of respect, honoring him in modesty and subjection. She therefore has no power on her head to pray because she has shown disrespect towards her leader.

When next someone remarks that your hair needs the split ends trimmed to allow it to grow and not look so dry, remember your long hair to this generation is a sign of obedience and a fine display of your attitude towards God's Anointed. Your hair was given to you for your glory and for His order and will for your life.

Question #4

How can I be outgoing without people thinking I'm flirting?

An outgoing person is generally a beautiful person. It is wonderful to see a happy, friendly and laughing young person and good humour is a gift from God. So easily though one can create a wrong impression, therefore young girls must be careful about their behavior. She will be judged by her actions.

There is nothing so unpleasant as somebody who is silly and superficial and shallow. Often a girl that is too 'friendly' is seen as uncultivated and people breathe a sigh of relief when she

leaves. By all means be a dispenser of joy. There is no harm in chatting, laughing and working together - just be careful not to laugh all the time.

If a girl makes herself too familiar in her friendships with boys, she is liable to give them a wrong impression of her. She may appear to them that she is somebody to cut up with, someone who has let down some of her womanly guards; that she does not expect to be treated with the deference and respect usually given to a good woman.

Avoid joking freely with men and avoid speaking and laughing in a very loud manner, as it does not suit a well brought up person. Having a freeway of friendship with men is not acceptable. A woman should have some reserve and her conduct should give the appearance of innocence and an atmosphere that is uplifting and enabling.

There is a tendency today for young people to touch one another. A dangerous practice whether in public or alone is to be too free to touch whether in joking or playing. A greeting should be a firm handshake and brief. When in company it does not look nice when a young man has his arm around a young lady's waist or worse still when she does the same to him.

Finally show that your spirit is attractive and flooded with the love and fragrance of the Lord Jesus Christ, well developed, gracious and balanced in all circumstances in life.

Question #5

How would you define headship?

One who has headship is one who holds the position or office of authority over another. He is the leader.

God says the husband is to be the head of the wife, as Christ is the head of the Church. It follows the principle that the husband is under the headship of Christ and the wife under the headship of the husband and the children follow this principle of obedience to parents.

Therefore, we all have a head to whom we are subject. The work of the head is to lead. The work and duty of the subject is to submit, which is to accept authority and to follow and obey. Abiding not with this structure disturbs the harmony, peace and proper order of God and brings chaos and imbalance.

As the head, the husband is the protector, provider, and guide and leads by determining the family rules and making decisions. The wife supports him by submitting, honoring his position as the head of the family and teaching the children to do so. The young girl is under the headship of her father until she assumes another headship, that is of her husband. The boy remains under the headship of the father until he assumes the responsibilities of husband.

On Friday, Bro Danny Steamen took the morning service. He imprinted words of wisdom on our hearts, "You must put your trust in God, based on what has set you free, not just on what you have learned."



Through the years of publication many powerful teaching articles were written with the intent to give guidance to young people in their walk with our Lord. Many youth were touched by those articles and Brother Paul still continues to receive letters to this day testifying from as far away as Africa of how Youth Quake encouraged and uplifted them, kept them going through the hard times and spiritually dry places.

I think that just about brings us up to date. Now, eight years later, the Lord has laid the burden on yet another group of young people's hearts to bless the youth of this generation through a publication directed specifically towards them.

As with any work of the Lord, or for that matter any undertaking you start in life, there has got to be a vision. Although the original Youth Quake started out as a means to connect the youth, the new Youth Quake is picking up the vision that the previous Youth Quake ended with. From watching the young people of this Message it has been noted that far too many of the youth are isolated from the rest of the Army of God. Not so much in respect to geographic location as it is in their minds. All too often we as believers feel that we are the only one's fighting on our battlefield. We feel that we are the only ones on the battlefields of lust, of confusion, of doubt, of despair, of family troubles and of any one of a thousand other things

but here it is as it stands now: If the Lord blesses our work for the young Bride who have internet access, we'd like to make Youth Quake available in the printed form for those without internet access. Even before YQN moves into a printed version we'd like to see the publication translated on the internet into Chinese, French, Spanish, Russian and maybe Portuguese and German. Big plans, yes – but we serve a big God.

However, before we continue on with our vision for the future, we have to cover our past expenses. I believed that if I was going to start YQN again, or do any work for the Lord, then it should be done right. We've invested in some of the industry's best software to bring you the best publication we could. The expenses should have come to \$2,000+ but the Lord blessed us by providing it at 1/4 that price. We're also using a borrowed computer to put this out, the cost for the computer would be \$400. Because of these expenses you can expect it to be a little while before we begin moving on with our vision. I've alerted you to these expenses to let you know that there is a need. We're not groping for cash here, but if the Lord would lay it on your heart to donate, we'd certainly be able to put it to good use.

I realize this has been rather lengthy and I apologize; hopefully though you have gotten an idea of what we're here for and the direction that this ministry is headed. May the Lord bless you.
