

The prophet of God is waiting for an answer concerning the people of God - Israel. They are getting ready to go into captivity because of their sins. The answer from God is this: They need the vision of God made plain, and then they can run. If they have the vision, they can live.

As Proverbs 29:18 says "Where [there is] no vision, the people perish..." God is saying, "Give my people clear spiritual eyesight by revelation, and they will be able to live and run spiritually."

I don't know if you ever realized it, but it wasn't until the last 100 years that the invention of television came out. It is something that can take the things we cannot see and transmit them through a screen so we can see them. No generation before has had such an inven-

tion. As Brother Branham showed in the message "Countdown", natural the achievements and advancements of science reflect the spiritual things going on in God's people. It was June 1967. My brother and I were waiting for my dad to come home from town. He had gone to buy us a softball. Roger and I walked to the old school bus shack to wait for him. While Roger was holding my hand and reading to me the writing on the wall, a drunk driver hit the little shack. The building disintegrated! I woke up about 35 feet up from the shack and in the middle of the road. I walked away unharmed. My brother was pinned between a truck and a tree. He died at the scene. The Passion



Review

Recently, a film director named Mel Gibson decided to make a movie called The Passion of Christ. This film, recently released which shows the last twelve hours of the life of Christ, from the Garden of Gethsemane to his death on Calvary and then a thirty-second scene of the Resurrection at the end of it. It seems there has been much publicity written about it in magazines, newspapers, movie reviews, and many people have been critical of it when they have given other, what I call gory movies, a top rating - but this one they have criticized. I personally believe this criticism is because this movie really touches them where they live and it goes against their unbelief and their blasphemy against the Lord Jesus.

I would highly recommend that if you plan to go to see this film, before you go, read the passion of Christ from the **Gospels**. Read everything you can from Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John and then after you have read that, repent, confess your sins and ask Jesus Christ to forgive your sins. Because if you go without having your sins under the blood, I think you can expect conviction to come upon you.

This movie is violent, it is rated R, it is bloody, but it is amazing how hard the critiques are on it when they turn around

and give something like the Gladiators a top rating, which was an extremely gory movie. It showed people being decapitated, emboweled, cut, slashed and just about every type of death that a person could imagine.

This film shows the passion of Christ, which means the suffering of Christ. It is not meant to glorify anything but to show the price he paid physically, as a man, for our sins. The scourging is as violent as I have ever seen. If anybody has seen "Ben Hur" and remember when the man was dragged under the chariot - if that made you squeamish, I want you to know that you will not be prepared to witness what they did to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. They mocked him, they spit on him, they cursed him, and they made fun of him.

When watching the movie or hearing about different scenes, you may say "how do they know such things happened?" Well, like Cecil B. Demil, he had many things in the Ten Commandments that was not mentioned in our Bible. However, these people draw from many ancient manuscripts, they read from history books, they look at the ancient paintings that were there, the statues, the scenes of the ancient people.... they even refer many materials that are in the Vatican Library. Now I know to

mention the Vatican is to attach to Catholicism, but may I say that when I first heard Brother Branham talk about having a crucifix in his church, that went against my grain. However, Brother Branham said, "Why should we give the Roman Catholics a monopoly on the cross of Jesus Christ?" So many people think just because something has Catholic attached to it, that they can automatically turn it down and criticize it and condemn it. I do not agree with that attitude.

If you know a little about the Catholic faith, you will notice the "Stations of the Cross" are played through the movie. I have walked these stations twice myself and each time I have been touched, because it makes what the Scripture says come alive. Where Jesus fell three times, where he is met by Mary, where his face is wiped with a cloth by Veronica, where Simon is made to help carry the cross and different scenes along the way. You might say, "Well, I don't believe that because it's Catholic." Well, I want you to know that we are Catholic. "universal Catholic means believer." It is the system that we are against, not the people, but you do need to know enough about the scriptures to be able to identify what is true and what is not.

bat Time Is It.

Why do we think the Rapture will occur in our lifetime? Is there a timeline somewhere? God's timing is perfect. We know that. However, how do we know where we are on God's timeline? If we are going to study current events, how do we know what is current according to God? As I mentioned in the last issue, it would be impossible to cover all of the relevant quotes and references in the space available here. However, I will do my best to point you to some references so you can study these issues in detail with the help of your own spiritual counselors. Paul taught us that one day to God is as 1000 years to man (II Pet 3:8). Brother Branham taught us that God built the world in six "days," then He rested for a "day," and then He labored in the world for six "days" after the creation. He also taught us that these last six "days" were divided into three two-"day" periods. Each of these periods was about 2000 years long. Brother Branham said that at the end of each 2000-year period "the world is shook back," something very significant happens. At the end of the first period, the world was destroyed by water. At the end of the second period, Christ came. The end of the third period will be marked by the Rapture. What follows that is the 1000-year millennium reign (the seventh "day"). Virgins, paragraph 161, 60-1211M).

So, what time is it according to God's timeline? Let me stress before I write the next few lines that I am not trying to offer some doctrinal position here. Rather, I would like to challenge you to try think about God's timeline the way He thinks about it. All too often, we fall into the trap of assuming that God sees things the way we see them. In reality, we find that we have often taken things for granted because of what the world has trained us to believe. For example, some would say the year 2000 should have marked the end of the third 2000-year period. It came and went without anything special happening. However, has it really come and gone?

Let me offer this thought. Brother Branham stated that at the end of the second period. "Christ come." One would assume that the same event would mark the beginning of the However, Christ third period. walked the earth for approximately 33 years. Which part of His 33-year tenure do you think God would choose to mark the transition between the second and third periods? Our calendar references Christ's birth as its starting point. However, God did not tell us to remember Christ's birth. He told us to cel-Resurrection. ebrate his because this represented his victory over death and the grave. Indeed, this is His greatest gift to mankind. If our calendar were to have begun with the Resurrection rather than Christ's birth, then it would have started 33 years later and it would be telling us that the current year is 1971.

Not so fast, Brother Branham also taught us that God's year was 360 days long (Seventy Weeks of Daniel, paragraph 91, 61-0806). He also stressed that God is the same yesterday today and forever. Therefore, if we assumed that God is still using a 360-day year instead of a 365.25-day year, then He is ticking the years off faster than we are. If we apply the ratio of 365.25/360 days to 1971 (for all you math buffs), we find that the current year according to that calendar would be about 1999.7, or roughly June/July of 1999. Has the year 2000 really come and gone? How close are we to the end of the third period? Do not get hung up on a precise date. The Scriptures teach us that no man knows the "day or hour" when He shall come. The point is that we should not assume that God stopped paying attention when our year 2000 came and went.

The Bible says that He is coming to take away a Bride that has "made herself ready" (Rev 19:7). Brother Branham tells us that the Bride makes herself ready with the help of the Holy Ghost. This would include letting her know when to be ready. How does He tell her that? The Scriptures tell us that He will provide signs. We will talk about the "signs of the times" next time.

dimension. They go into something like a trance and can see the past, present, future, and whatever else God allows them to see. Think about how God even allowed Brother Branham to see Marilyn Monroe while she was dying at 4 a.m. in the morning. Marilyn was of course the hottest Hollywood actress back in that day. She would be a modern dav Julia Roberts or Nicole Kidman. If God could let His prophet see that, it should show us that God knows what's going on in this age. If he knew Marilyn Monroe, he certainly knows you. And just think, she never got to see the Message of Christ like you can see it today. That should make you rejoice.

The second meaning Webster gave is where we come in. We are not built to see visions like a prophet, but we can catch the same exact vision when it is supernaturally revealed in our hearts. In the movie, you will see

But then I found the quote where Brother Branham said he looked like he had gone through a meat grinder. Brother Branham also said that they laid his rib cage open, until you could see his innards. The movie also shows Christ bones being disjointed when they put him on the cross,

but they never break his bones, just as the psalmist David said.
